2023-2024 DANCE DRESS CODES

Dress Code:

Dress code is dependent upon the type of dance in an attempt to maintain a level of decorum appropriate for the evening and activities.

• Athletic Event Dress Code (5th Quarter):

- At all games and activities HOME & AWAY (unless specified otherwise) students must adhere to the school dress code. The following exceptions will be made for game day dress code:
 - Guys may wear tank tops, athletic shorts, and hats.
 - Girls may wear leggings and shorts with modesty (no short shorts, meaning no cheeks should be showing). Biker shorts are okay as long as they hit mid-thigh (usually a 7-9" inseam).
 - Holes in jeans are acceptable if there is still modesty.
- What is still unacceptable at any VC Games and activities HOME or AWAY:
 - Crop Tops, Tube Tops, or any clothing that exposes bras, boxers, underwear or any inappropriate messages on clothing or hats.

• Semiformal Dress Code (Homecoming & Winter Formal):

- Girls SEMIFORMAL Dress Code:
 - No dresses with plunging back lines and/or partial cutouts below the middle of the back (about 2" below the natural bra line).
 - Strapless dresses with sweetheart or straight-across necklines are acceptable no keyholes or plunging V's.
 - Dresses should not expose excessive cleavage or the midriff.
 - The length of a dress or a slit in the dress may be no more than 5 inches above the top of the knees.
 - No two-piece dresses allowed.
 - No dresses that are excessively form fitting, requiring lots of fixing to stay in place.
 - Lace, netting, flesh-colored fabrics, or other see-through materials are not acceptable to cover or fix one of the issues above (slits, keyholes, length, etc.).
- Boys SEMIFORMAL Dress Code:
 - Boys are expected to wear a DRESS SHIRT with DRESS SLACKS. Shirts are to remain buttoned at all times.
 - Bow ties and ties are highly encouraged for semi-formal events.
 - A vest or suit jacket are OPTIONAL.
 - Grooming Standards from the Student Handbook apply hair should be neat and trim, hair below shoulders should be tied back. No earrings allowed.

• Formal Dress Code (Prom):

- Girls FORMAL Dress Code:
 - No dresses with plunging back lines and/or partial cutouts below the middle of the back (about 2" below the natural bra line).
 - Strapless dresses with sweetheart or straight-across necklines are acceptable no keyholes or plunging V's.
 - Dresses should not expose excessive cleavage or the midriff.
 - The length of a dress or a slit in the dress may be no more than 5 inches above the top of the knees.
 - No two-piece dresses allowed.
 - No dresses that are excessively form fitting, requiring lots of fixing to stay in place.
 - Lace, netting, flesh-colored fabrics, or other see-through materials are not acceptable to cover or fix one of the issues above (slits, keyholes, length, etc.).
- Boys FORMAL Dress Code:
 - Boys are expected to wear a TUX or SUIT with a long-sleeved dress shirt.
 - Ties or bow ties are HIGHLY ENCOURAGED for formal events.
 - Dress Shoes are HIGHLY ENCOURAGED for formal events.
 - A vest is OPTIONAL.
 - Shirts are to remain buttoned at all times.
 - Grooming Standards from the Student Handbook apply hair should be neat and trimmed, hair below shoulders should be tied back. No earrings allowed.

If a student's attire does not meet these standards, he or she will not be admitted into the event.
