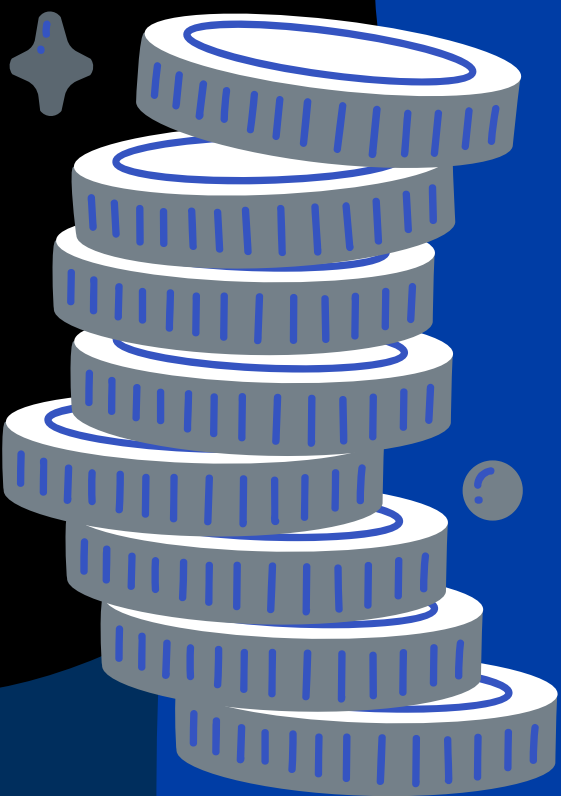


FAFSA UPDATES FOR SENIORS

CHECKLIST

- ✿ Students and parents can create their FSA ID
- ✿ FAFSA ID is a requisite first step in submitting the FAFSA
- ✿ Students should create their ID first
- ✿ Students should then invite parents and/or other contributors to create ID
- ✿ Contributors will receive an email to begin the FAFSA
- ✿ Once ID is created, it takes up to 3 days for verification

Contributors



Who is a contributor?

- Anyone who provides information on the FAFSA
- Includes: student, student's spouse, biological or adoptive parent an/or the student's step-parent.

Who is NOT a contributor?

- Grandparents, foster parents, legal guardians, brothers, sisters
- Any other non immediate relatives even if they provide for or raise the student

8 STEPS TO COMPLETING THE FAFSA

#1 Create an Account and Gather Documents: Set up a StudentAid.gov account for both you and your child. Gather necessary documents like Social Security numbers, tax returns, and bank statements.

#2 Start the FAFSA Form: Go to fafsa.gov, log in, and start a new form. Enter your child's personal information accurately.

#3 Complete Student Personal Circumstances: Answer questions to determine if your child is a dependent or independent student.

#4 Provide Consent and Approval: Verify your information and consent to transfer tax info from the IRS.

#5 Complete Parent Demographics: Provide your marital status and state of legal residence.

#6 Complete Parent Financials: Enter financial details based on your 2022 tax return.

#7 Review and Sign: Review all entered information for accuracy and sign the form electronically.

#8 Submit the FAFSA Form: Submit the completed form and wait for confirmation.
